EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (EAP)

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this by and between **Guidance EAP**, a division of **Ozark Guidance Center, Inc.**, located at 2400 South 48th Street, Springdale, Arkansas 72766 (herein known as the "**Center**") and **City of Springdale, Arkansas** with its principal offices located at 201 Spring street, Springdale, Arkansas, 72764 (herein known as the "**Company**").

WHEREAS, the Company desires to contract with the Center to operate the Company's Employee Assistance Program (the "**Program**") for the period set for the below, and

WHEREAS, the Provider desires to operate the Program on the terms and conditions set forth below:

1. Appointment of Program Coordinator. The Company shall designate an employee or other person to act as the Program Coordinator for the Company to monitor the program for the Company, to cooperate with the Center in their operation of the Program, and to perform the other services required of the program Coordinator in the Agreement.

2. Services provided by Center. During the term of this agreement and in accordance with reasonable, written policies and procedures adopted by the Company and in accordance with industry standard EAP technologies, the Center agrees to make available the following services:

(a) Consult with the Program Coordinator in regards to Program to ensure its success. Through this relationship the Program will be designed, modified, implemented and evaluated. The Center will seek to understand company policies, clarify roles, and continuously strive to improve services for positive outcomes.

(b) Conduct information and training sessions for managers and supervisory personnel to instruct them on the use of EAP services and how the program can support employees, assist supervisors and increase performance and morale. The Company shall provide sufficient space for training sessions and shall permit management and supervisory personnel to attend on company time.

(c) Provide personalized written communication with employees of the Company to increase awareness of EAP services and to encourage them to seek help before a problem becomes debilitating. Written and published materials may take the form of posters, paycheck stuffers, newsletters, and wallet cards. Other material and means may be developed jointly with the Program Coordinator.

(d) Make available educational and employee development programs designed to improve workplace milieu. Topics may include but are not limited to: Stress

Management, Workplace Violence, Conflict Resolution, Warning Signs of Depression and Anxiety, Couples Communication, Communicating with Teenagers, Anger Management, and Substance Abuse. See **Schedule B** (attached hereto) for additional topics and charges, if applicable.

(e) **Accept** referrals of eligible employees and covered dependents, as identified by the Company, to the entry center. This unit will provide an initial telephone assessment for referrals to the program. Assessments are available Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. After the telephone screening an appointment will be made with a licensed mental health professional in a timely manner.

(f) **Maintain** a 24hr, 7 day a week emergency call system. After hours emergencies will be assessed by a mental health professional through the after hours toll-free number, 1.800.234-7052.

(g) **At** the Company's request and with the appropriate employee release, advise the manager or supervisor of an employee referred to the Program whether the employee made and kept the appointment. The provider will not provide case management or progress reports on employees other than statistical follow-up to the Program Coordinator.

(h) Provide up to Five (5) outpatient counseling sessions, per contract year, with a licensed mental health professional (exclusive of physician services and psychological testing) for each referred employee and/or each eligible dependent. Additionally, before, during, or after these sessions, the Center, if necessary and indicated, shall assist the employee/dependent in finding other qualified resources in the community that may be beneficial to the resolution of the presenting problem. The Center has no financial responsibility for any treatment provided, or service rendered, to the employee/dependent by such referred sources.

(i) **Make** available a trained Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) team. Should a traumatic event occur at the Company workplace, the team will respond, at the Program Coordinators request, within 48 hours of the incident. Cost of providing a (CISM) team, if applicable, is outlined on **Exhibit A**.

3. **Term.** The term of this agreement shall be for one (1) year commencing _____, 201. After the initial term, this Agreement shall be considered to be self-renewing in one-year increments. The benefits provided under this Agreement shall be renewed on January 1st of each year. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice of termination to the other party.

4. **Fees.** In consideration of the services provided by the Center under this Agreement, the Company agrees to pay the Center the fees set forth on **Exhibit A** (attached hereto and incorporated herein) within thirty (30) days of receiving an invoice from the Center for such services.

5. **Periodic Reports.** The Center shall supply the Company with information and statistics for analysis and monitoring of Program activity. The information provided shall include, but not necessarily limited to, the number of employees/dependents served, the number of sessions used, satisfaction surveys, and problem area addressed.

6. **Exclusivity.** The Company agrees that during the term of this Agreement, the Center shall be the exclusive provider of services for or with respect to the EAP program.

7. **Records.** All records and data maintained by the Center concerning the program, including client records, shall be the sole property of the Center and shall be confidential. Records will not be released to anyone without the express written consent of the individual involved.

8. **Assignment.** This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the written consent of the other party.

The duly authorized representatives of The City of Springdale, Arkansas and Guidance EAP by affixing their signatures agree to execute this Agreement.

This Agreement shall supercede any other Agreement that may be in effect at the time of the execution of this Agreement.

A RESOLUTION WAIVING THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE FEE DURING THE MISSION OF MERCY EVENT AT THE NORTHWEST ARKANSAS CONVENTION CENTER.

WHEREAS, on May 16, 2014, and May 17, 2014, the Arkansas Mission of Mercy group performed free dental procedures at the Northwest Arkansas Convention Center to those in the area who cannot afford to pay for dental care, thereby benefitting the citizens of the City of Springdale, Arkansas;

WHEREAS, Section 32-38 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Springdale, Arkansas, requires a fee to be paid to the City upon the rendering of emergency medical services;
