## Sec. 46-56. - Fireworks.

- (a)  
(1) No person shall sell or distribute in the city any firecrackers, sky rockets, bottle rockets, sparklers, roman candles, or any other explosive used for amusement purposes, or any other device or composition used to obtain visible or audible pyrotechnic display, except as specifically set out herein.
- (a)  
(2) Fireworks which are not prohibited under law (Ark. Code Ann. § 20-22-701, et seq.) and which are considered consumer fireworks as defined under federal law (27 C.F.R. § 555.11) may be sold in the city between June 28th and July 5th of any year, subject to the provisions set out herein. Any person desiring to sell fireworks within the city must obtain a permit through the city clerk's office. The charge for each permit shall be \$500.00 per location. One-half of the permit fee (\$250.00) shall be placed in the revenue account of the city fire department to cover the cost of fire inspections of locations where fireworks are sold. Before a permit to sell fireworks is issued by the city clerk, the person applying for the permit must show proof that such location will be insured by a licensed insurance company for \$1,000,000.00 premises liability. A vendor must contact the Springdale Fire Department and arrange for an inspection by the fire marshal to ensure compliance with city ordinance and fire code requirements prior to the sale of fireworks.
- (a)  
(3) No fireworks shall be sold or stored within a permanent structure of the city. Further, no fireworks stand shall be located anywhere within the city, except in a C-2, C-5 or A-1 zone provided the A-1 property has frontage on a federal or state highway. All locations where fireworks are sold must comply with all Arkansas and federal law, as well as the 2000 International Fire Code and the 2002 Arkansas Fire Prevention Code, as adopted by the city.
- (a)  
(4) No person selling fireworks within the city shall be allowed to sell any fireworks which travels on a stick, as these particular fireworks are prohibited to be discharged within the city.
- (a)  
(5) No fireworks stand shall be located within 250 feet of a fuel dispensing facility and all fireworks stands must have at least 50-foot setback from the street or highway.
- (a)  
(6) No person under the age of 16 shall be allowed to purchase fireworks within the city.
- (a)  
(7) All locations where fireworks are sold within the city shall post a sign, visible to the public, which states, "The discharge of bottle rockets or fireworks that travel on a stick are prohibited in the City of Springdale."
- (b)  
(1)

No person shall discharge at any place, public or private, within the city boundaries, any aerial firework(s) which travels on a stick, except a permit may be obtained for a public display of fireworks, as more particularly set out in this section.

(b)

(2)

The fire chief shall permit the use of fireworks for outdoor public display when all provisions of NFPA 1123 are met and after all necessary permits have been issued. If any such permit is issued, any such display shall be handled by a competent operator approved by the fire chief, and shall be of such character and so located, discharged or fired so as not to be hazardous to property or endanger any person. No such permit shall be authorized except for the following:

A.

Between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. on July 1st through July 4th of any year; or

B.

At professional sporting events in a P-1 zone provided that the property adjacent to the P-1 zone is commercial or agricultural, between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on April 1st through September 30th of any year; or

C.

During the four day performance of the Rodeo of the Ozarks held at the rodeo grounds at Old Missouri Road and Emma Avenue before the hours of 11:00 p.m. and as part of the Rodeo of the Ozarks celebration;

D.

Small test firing to determine the feasibility of the discharge site for future public display, provided no salute shells are discharged and provided that any such test firings shall be between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., between April 1st and June 30th of any year.

(c)

No fireworks, including firecrackers, sparklers, or Roman candles may be discharged within the city except as set out as follows:

(c)

(1)

All legal fireworks, except aerial fireworks that travel on a stick, may be discharged on private property between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. on July 1st through July 4th of any year, provided that the owner of the private property consents to such discharge of the fireworks; and

(c)

(2)

A person of at least 21 years of age shall supervise the discharge of any fireworks if any person participating in the activity is under the age of 16.

Sec. 98-61. - Requirements for specific sign types. 

(a)

*Billboards.* No billboard shall be constructed, erected, used or maintained within the city except in compliance with the following provisions:

(1)

Billboards shall be located only in specified commercial and industrial zones and shall not be placed within 300 feet of any residential zone.

(2)

Each billboard shall have a maximum of two sign faces, one per side, supported by the same structural foundation. Each face shall have a maximum total area of 300 square feet, except that billboards located adjacent to a divided highway may have a maximum sign face area of 600 square feet. All measurements shall include sign face framework and decorative or other additions.

(3)

All billboards located within the city shall meet the state's requirements for distance between billboards.

(4)

No billboard shall exceed 45 feet in total height.

(5)

No billboards shall be permitted in A-1 agricultural or C-3 central commercial zoning districts.

(6)

No billboards shall be erected or permitted after May 27, 2008, however, a legal existing billboard may be relocated to a different location on the same property without obtaining a new permit, so long as the billboard still meets the other requirements set out in this section. Relocation of a billboard on the same property shall not violate the city's moratorium requirements on billboards.

(7)

Every billboard which is permitted and legally existing on May 27, 2008, shall be deemed to be a legal nonconforming billboard. A nonconforming billboard may not be enlarged or altered in any way which increases its nonconformity, however, a legal existing billboard may be relocated to a different location on the same property without obtaining a new permit, so long as the billboard still meets the other requirements set out in this section. Relocation of a billboard on the same property shall not violate the city's moratorium requirements on billboards.

(8)

A legal nonconforming billboard will become an illegal sign if more than 50 percent of the sign is removed or unassembled for a period of more than six months; or if the sign is altered or relocated in any manner which increases its nonconformity or causes it to be less in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.

(9)

A legal nonconforming billboard will become an illegal sign if the nonconforming billboard is destroyed to an extent of 50 percent or more of its sign face. The board of adjustment may grant a variance to repair or replace a destroyed nonconforming billboard, upon a showing of hardship, and application for such variance shall be made within 30 days of the nonconforming billboard being destroyed. If a variance is granted, the nonconforming billboard shall be replaced or repaired according to standards of construction then in effect.

(b)

*Construction signs.* Construction signs shall have a maximum sign face area of 32 square feet and a maximum sign area of 64 square feet. All such signs shall be removed within five days of completion of the project.

(c)

*Garage, porch or yard sale signs.* Garage, porch or yard sale signs shall advertise only occasional residential sales of used goods. Each sign shall be freestanding and shall have maximum sign-face dimensions of 24 inches by 24 inches, shall have a maximum sign area of eight square feet and shall have a maximum height of 24 inches. Each sign shall meet all requirements specified for temporary signs and banners, except that it shall be erected no more than two days prior to the first date of the sale and will be removed by the beginning of the first business day following the last day of the sale and shall be displayed without lighting having a primary purpose or effect of illuminating the sign.

(d)

*Government signs.* Government signs shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter.

(e)

*Monument signs.* The maximum sign area for a monument sign shall not exceed 100 square feet. The sign display area shall be completely enclosed with materials that match the facade of the principal use or similar quality, color and texture as the primary masonry materials used in the exterior finish of the primary structure on site. The top of the sign display area shall be located a maximum of 12 inches below the top of the sign structure. No air space shall be visible within or between any portion of the sign display area and sign structure.

(f)

*Neon signs.* Neon signs shall have an enclosed, vented transformer box and shall be constructed according to standard industry safety practices. For purposes of this provision, the term "neon signs" shall include all signs using neon gas whether or not located inside or outside of a permanent building.

(g)

*Political signs.* Political signs shall not be required to meet all requirements specified for temporary signs and banners, but shall be dismantled and removed within three days after the date of the election.

(h)

*Projecting signs.* Projecting signs shall be located a minimum of ten feet from any other such sign and shall not exceed 32 square feet in sign face area.

(i)

*Real estate signs.*

(1)

Real estate signs in residential zones will be displayed only on the premises being advertised and will not exceed a maximum sign-face area of six square feet and maximum sign area of 12 square feet; provided, however, that any sign giving notice of and directions to any open house being shown for sale may be displayed off the premises advertised so long as it is otherwise maintained in full compliance with the size requirements of this subsection and the removal provisions of subsection (c) of this section. A total of two riders are allowed per panel.

(2)

Real estate signs in all other zones will be displayed only on the premises being advertised and will not exceed a maximum sign area of 32 square feet.

(j)

*Special occasion signs.* Special occasion signs shall advertise only occasional, noncommercial special events of no more than seven days' duration. Each sign shall meet the requirements of subsection (j) of this section, except that it shall be erected no more than seven days prior to the first day of the special occasion

or event and shall be removed by the end of the third day after the end of the special occasion or event.

(k)

*Temporary signs and banners.* A temporary sign is a sign that is used only temporarily and is not permanently mounted, and that can be used only for a designated period of time. A banner is any sign, except an awning sign, applied to or made of cloth, paper, fabric, flexible plastic or other fabric-like material that only uses such non-rigid material for backing or background. Signs and banners for special events, or the opening of businesses, are permitted provided that:

(1)

A temporary use permit is obtained;

(2)

Such signs and banners are prohibited upon public rights-of-way and may not be placed so as to obstruct a driver's ability to view oncoming traffic from any direction at an intersection;

(3)

Temporary sign and banner permits shall be limited to a duration of not to exceed 15 consecutive days or the period of time stated on the temporary use permit and shall not be issued within 90 days of the previous issuance;

(4)

No more than four temporary sign or banner permits shall be issued within any 12-month period for the same business in the same location;

(5)

A newly established business may be issued a temporary use permit for the initial opening of a business for a period that shall end not later than 60 days after issuance of the first business license for that business in that location or from the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for that location;

(6)

Temporary signs and banners may be attached to and parallel with a wall of the building on which wall signs are permitted and shall not exceed 32 square feet in surface area;

(7)

There shall be only one temporary sign or banner, plus one additional sign or banner for street frontage on a second public street, provided that the frontage on that street is at least 150 feet in length and that an actual entrance to the site is permitted on such street.

(8)

"Not-for-profit" special events, such as those associated with civic, philanthropic, educational purposes, and religious purposes shall be allowed a temporary sign or banner, regardless of whether a temporary use permit is required, provided that:

a.

Only one such sign or banner shall be allowed per property per event;

b.

Such sign or banner shall be located only on private property;

c.

Such sign, if a ground sign, shall be limited to 42 inches in height and 16 square feet in area per side;

d.

Such sign, if attached to a wall, shall be limited to 32 square feet in area per side; and

e.

Such sign or banner shall be erected no sooner than five days preceding the event and shall be removed no later than one day following the event.

(l)

*Traffic/directional signs.* Traffic/directional signs shall not exceed three square feet in area except upon a special permit issued by the chief city inspector upon showing of clear necessity and shall be permissible in all zones.

(m)

*Wall signs.* No wall sign shall extend above any adjacent parapet or roof of the supporting building nor exceed a sign area of 300 square feet or 30 percent of the area of the wall face on which the sign is located, whichever is less. Wall signs shall be mounted in compliance with the specifications of Table No. 1:

(n)

*Street island signs.* Street island signs shall not exceed a height of three feet above the top of the curb; and the maximum sign face area shall not exceed 15 square feet. Such signs may be placed only in curbed street islands or medians with a minimum width of ten feet back-of-curb to opposing back-of-curb.

(o)

*Church, synagogue and/or 501(c)(3) qualified organization signs.* These signs shall be allowed only on premises and may include nonflashing wall or projecting signs with a sign area not to exceed 32 square feet, a nonflashing, freestanding sign no larger than 300 square feet per sign face. Sign height shall not exceed 40 feet.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SPRINGDALE  
PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT TO PURCHASE AN  
ASPHALT PAVING MACHINE**

**WHEREAS**, the existing 1993 model asphalt paving machine used by the Public Works Department has reached the end of its service life, and

**WHEREAS**, Riggs Caterpillar in Springdale, Arkansas has available a new 2011 Caterpillar asphalt paving machine model AP555E equipped with the screed type and options that fits the requirements of typical paving applications of the Public Works Department, and

**WHEREAS**, Riggs Caterpillar is listed as the heavy equipment vendor on the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration procurement program Contract # 4600025551 thru the National Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA) municipal cooperative purchasing program of which the Springdale Public Works Department is member # 85588, and

**WHEREAS**, the cost for the new 2011 Caterpillar asphalt paving machine model AP555E after the State contract discount (16% or \$61,869.60) and the Riggs Caterpillar volume discount of \$30,045.14) are applied, comes to a final price of \$331,554.26, and

**WHEREAS**, CIP Project Number 1305 in the amount of \$1,543,966 for the 2013 Street Paving Contract is complete as of July 16, 2013 and finished under budget by 8.71% with funds available in the amount of \$134,432, said funds to be applied to the cost of the aforementioned asphalt paving machine.

**WHEREAS**, the balance of \$197,122.26 necessary to purchase the asphalt paving equipment shall be CIP funds, this said amount to be reimbursed back to the CIP fund out of the Public Works Department 2014 budget.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF SPRINGDALE, ARKANSAS**, that the Springdale Public Works Department is authorized to utilize funds available from completed CIP Project Number 1305 in the amount of \$134,432 plus an additional \$197,122.26 from the CIP fund for the total payment on the aforementioned asphalt paving machine in the amount of \$331,554.26. The CIP funds in the amount of \$197,122.26 will be reimbursed to the CIP fund from the 2014 Public Works Department Capital Equipment Account # 201-0201-431.80-30.
