To Mayor Sprouse and Fire and Police Committee Chair Powell;

We would like to request to place on the Fire and Police Committee agenda a request to purchase a total of three AeroClave RDS3110 disinfecting systems. The Police Department would like to purchase one and the Fire Department would like to purchase two.

The Police Department would like to purchase their unit with possible grant funding for COVID-19.

The Fire Department received a total of \$48,000 from HHS as part of a grant to help offset the cost of current and future COVID-19 expenditures.

The units are listed on the HGAC Buy-board which eliminates the need to go out for bid and the cost of each unit is \$16,811.21 and that includes the ability to fog an area and also utilize a hand sprayer. The unit is fully self-contained and can be set up and operating in minutes. The price of the unit includes the portable applicator, as well as three cases of disinfectant solution per unit as well as shipping, handling, and taxes.

We currently have three portable hand units (currently only one working) and they are not holding up to the increased use due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We would like to purchase these units to address our immediate needs with sanitation as well as future needs if we see the second wave this fall as many are predicting.

The Police department would expend \$16,811.21 from the grant and the Fire Department would expend \$33,622.42 from the \$48,000 funding we received from HHS.
